Breathing to create peace and calm

Sitting on the floor or a chair, close your eyes and imagine you are a hibernating bear

Breath in deeply, focus on holding your breath for the count of 4, and then exhale.



LION BREATH

Breathing to help release anger and frustration

Take a deep breath in, fill your lungs with air.

Exhale. letting all the air out through your mouth as you roar like a lion.



BUNNY BREATH

Breathing for when you're upset and can't find your breath

Sitting on your knees, begin by wiggling your nose like a bunny rabbit.

Take 3 quick sniffs in through your nose and then one long exhale out through your nose Continue to regulate breathing




