Avalanche – Myles, Tyler M

Loose snow avalanches account for only a small percentage of death. Avalanches come from a sudden shift in the ground.

Avatar - Austin and Charlotte

We made an Avatar and it represents the destruction elements can cause.

Bushfire - Gabriella, Mackenzie and Indi

Bushfires are a natural disaster. They happen a lot. Bushfires are dangerous.

Landslide - Eliza and Zavannah

Landslides can move slow to very high speeds. Landslides can be very small or very big.

Flood - Lexie and Hilary

Ninety percent of all natural disasters involve flooding. Just 1 inch of water can cause \$27,000 in damage to your home.

Tornado – Lucy, Lottie and Frankie

Most tornadoes last less than 10 minutes and travel 5-10 kilometers before disappearing. Tornadoes normally occur near the trailing edge of a thunderstorm. The strongest tornadoes have rotating winds of more than 250mph.

Volcano - Tyler P, Ruby and Slade

An erupting volcano can cause a landslide. Volcano eruption can affect buildings nearby.

Tsunami - Ethan, Joel and Harry

Tsunamis are giant waves caused by earthquakes or volcanic eruptions under the sea. The first wave is usually the biggest and strongest.

Approximately 80% of tsunamis happen inside the Pacific Ocean's 'Ring of Fire'.
